



ACTA LIQUIDA - THE PROJECT 04 | 05 - 16 | 06 2024

Acta Liquida, a Salzkammergut 2024 project, is a transdisciplinary art project by three artists that spans the arc between Lake Traunsee, climate change, history and memory and thus fish culture.

Heidi Zednik abstracts the natural processes of the deepest Salzkammergut lake: filter material collected over decades from the Altmünster fish hatchery hut is installed, showing changes in the weather, sediment and pollution. They are complimented by drawings, prints and objects.

The audiovisual installation "memories of an extincting kind" by multimedia artist **Elza Grimm** focuses on the change in species and habitats in Central European freshwaters due to climatic and other man-made changes. The installation is made up of several individual hologram and sound elements. The centerpiece is the projection of an experimental short film. The beauty and grace of the Reinanke serves as inspiration for the installation in form and movement. The fish species, which is native to Lake Traunsee, forms the leitmotif of the installation and is shown in 3D animations from different perspectives at various stages of its life.

The opening took place on May 4 at 17:00 in the Aurachmühle, with Christina Jaritsch (Salzkammergut 2024 Program Management Climate Change, Gender, Diversity) and the artists.

The finissage will take place on June 16 at 11:00 a.m. in Schoss Ort, with a performance on the theme by Paul Jaeg. The artists were present at the opening and will also be present at the finissage.
